LEGAL FRAMEWORK OF CO-MANAGEMENT IN PORTUGAL

Law Decree 73/2020 of September 23rd Approves the legal regime for professional fishing, framing and defining procedures for the implementation of co-management as a governance model in fisheries

Sumário: Aprova o regime jurídico do exercício da atividade profissional da pesca comercial marítima e da autorização, registo e licenciamento dos navios ou embarcações utilizadas na referida atividade.

CAPÍTULO III

Da cogestão

Artigo 12.º

Cogestão

1 — Por cogestão entende-se o regime de gestão partilhada dos recursos vivos e dos meios necessários à sua captura e aproveitamento económico, o qual visa a gestão sustentável dos recursos e a concretização do princípio da máxima colaboração mútua.

2 — O regime da cogestão é aplicável a certas pescarias ou em determinadas áreas de pesca e operacionaliza-se através da criação de comités e instrumentos de gestão.

Artigo 13.º

Princípios

A cogestão rege-se pelos seguintes princípios:

- Participação dos vários interessados (*stakeholders*) nas decisões de planeamento e gestão;
- Precaução, com vista ao planeamento e gestão dos recursos segundo critérios científicos e com objetivos estabelecidos em bases científicas, de sustentabilidade a curto, médio e longo prazos;
- Valorização e rentabilização do produto da pesca, através do estabelecimento de limites às capturas;
- Reconversão e diversificação das atividades, sempre que se justifique.

Artigo 14.º

Comités de cogestão

1 — Os comités de cogestão (comités) são compostos pelos representantes da pescaria ou da área em que a mesma se desenvolve.

2 — Os representantes a que se refere o número anterior são designados:

- Pelo membro do Governo responsável pela área do mar;
- Pelas associações de pescadores;
- Pelas organizações de produtores;
- Pelas organizações sindicais;
- Pelas organizações não-governamentais;
- Pela comunidade científica;
- Pelas autarquias locais, em razão da área territorial;

LEGAL FRAMEWORK OF CO-MANAGEMENT IN PORTUGAL

Representativeness

75% of the holders of licenses corresponding to the fishery and area concerned must be represented in the Committee (Article 15.2)

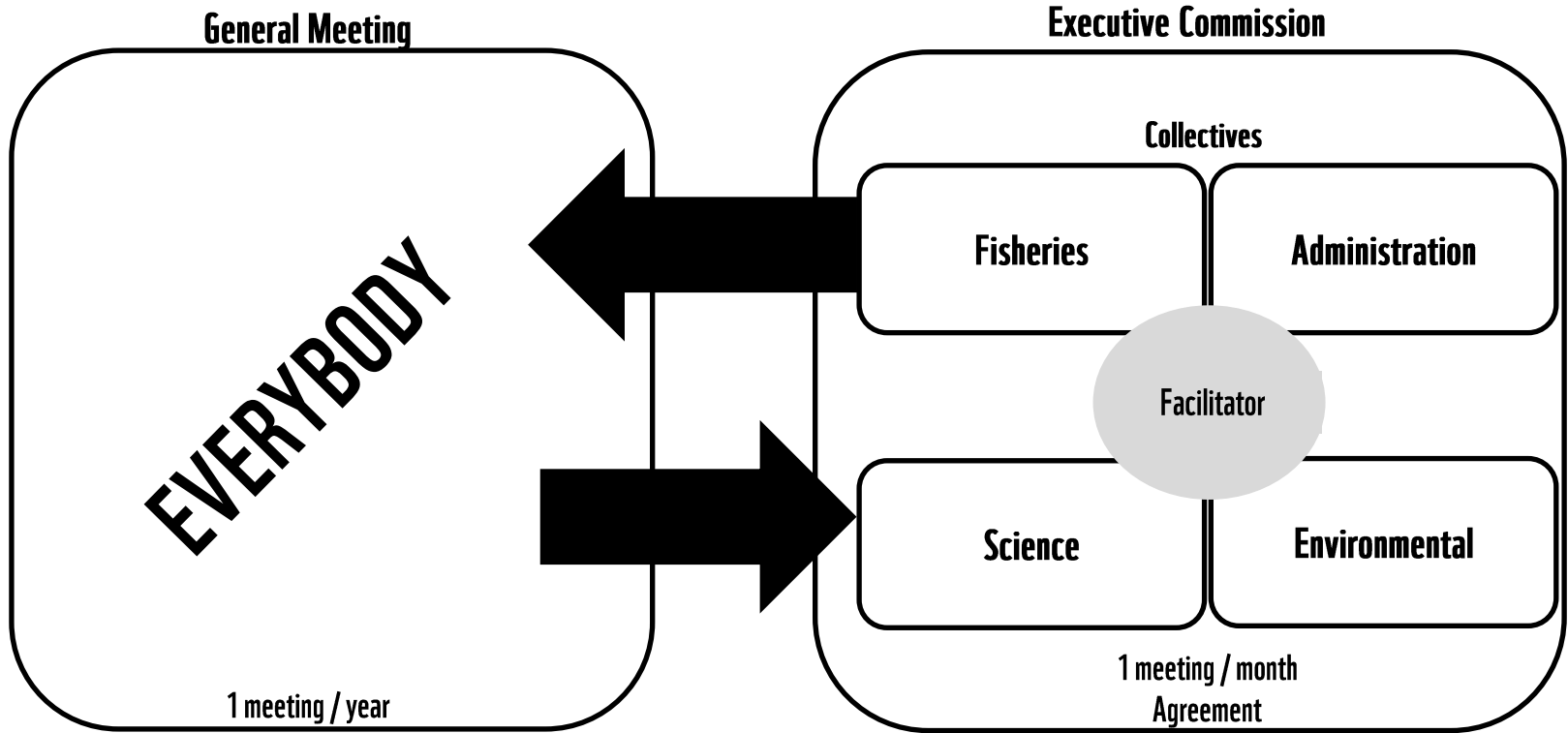
Mission

The committees' mission is the sustainable management and monitoring of the fishery or respective area, according to scientific knowledge, evaluating the available data and coordinating the various activities involved (Article 16.1)

Competence

Define and approve the proposals for Management Plans to be submitted to the Government for approval, monitor their execution and report non-compliances (Article 16.2)
The committees are endowed with regulatory competence in matters that fall within their scope of action, in terms to be defined in their respective statute (Article 16.3)
