EU support to apiculture

- In place since 1997
- Objective improve general conditions for production and marketing of apiculture products
- Scope honey, royal jelly, pollen, propolis or bees wax





National apiculture programmes (NAP)

- EU supports the apiculture sector via national apiculture programmes (NAP) drawn up by the Member States
- Voluntary but used by all Member States






Objectives of CAP 2013 reform for apiculture

- Adapt eligible measures to the needs of the sector
- Ensure a sounder allocation of the EU budget - reliable method for establishing number of hives
- EU budget increased from 33 to 36 million Euro per year






Total 16 million beehives in the EU

MS Comments - annual reports on the implementation 2017

A – **technical assistance**: "the set up of a website for communication for beekeepers was a hit"

C - rationalisation of transhumance: "the EU-aid was needed for obtaining the special hive-transportation equipment"

E – **restocking of hives:** "The measure provided support to procurement of high-quality tested queen bees and the beneficiaries of the measure were their breeders."



Is honey always honey?



- 2015 Commission control plan to assess the market of adulterated honey
- 14% of the the samples contained added sugar
- Results indicate that honey of both EU and non-EU origin is being adulterated by sugar
- The controls of fraudelent practices is primarily the responsibility of the Member State.
- The Commission strenghtenis the legal framework for combatting food fraud – Regulation on Official Controls. Targeted controls, financial penalties to be dissuassive, protection of whistle blowers.






