





# LIVELIHOOD AND CONSERVATION IMPACTS



- Enterprise-oriented forest management
- Devolving authority to manage the harvests to communities through the establishment of CFUGs
- The FairWild certification consumer confidence
- Fairer prices enhance livelihood benefits without compromising ecological sustainability.





# TOWARDS SUSTAINABLE USE AND TRADE IN WILD SPECIES

- Sustainable use and trade in wild species provides an important contribution to conservation of species and ecosystems, and multiple socio-economic co-benefits
- The development of policy frameworks needs to actively involve IP and LC, ensuring their full participation and engagement in decision-making processes
- A range of regulatory and non-regulatory measures can support implementation at local, national and global levels
- Important to integrate/consider benefits and costs of wildlife use and trade along the value chains: for people living with wildlife, for other 'users'
- Indicators for the measurement and adaptive management of use and trade need to be developed, rooted in the national-level metrics
- There are multiple opportunities for scaling-up good practices and solutions
