


Achieving Sustainable Fisheries

- 50% reduction in **fishing effort** in 20 years (historic lows)
- 5 TACs set in line with **MSY** in 2009 vs more than 60 at present
- 99% Atlantic **landings** from EU-managed stocks = sustainable
- 37% overall increase in stock **biomass** (2003-2022)

The eternal promise MSY = more fish, more money, more jobs




Fleet & Fishing effort decline



EU fishing fleet workers






Aging crews – Generational Gap

- Lack of generational change despite salary improvements


Food Production Food sovereignty / self-sufficiency in decline




European Union hits record-low levels of seafood self-sufficiency as dependence on imports grows




The bloc is now dependent on imports for over 70% of all its seafood needs.

New Trawl Gear Demonstrates Catch Increases and Less Impact on Seabed

An example of innovative fishing gear: New semi-pelagic otterboards have been developed in the last years by different door manufactures (e.g. Thyborøn, Denmark; Polar fishing gear, Iceland; Morgére, France). These semipelagic otterboards can eliminate seabed contact by operating 2-5 m off the seafloor while keeping the trawl on the ground, thus maintaining the same harvesting and catch efficiency. As a result, there is significantly less

DECIMATING THE DUTCH FLEET

The Dutch beam trawl fleet is about to be cut dramatically, due to a combination of high fuel prices, loss of fishing grounds, resistance in Danish, Norwegian and UK waters, relatively poor catches and strict NOx measures in the future.



In January 2022 there were 72 large beamers under the Dutch flag. This figure had not changed much over the last five years, but insiders are fairly sure there will be only 35 left by next year – possibly even fewer than that.


